Dr. Paul Chappell has been privileged to serve as senior pastor of Lancaster Baptist Church for twenty-four years. He is the founder of Lancaster Baptist School, West Coast Baptist College, and Striving Together Publications.



Dr. R. B. Ouellette has been the pastor of the First Baptist Church of Bridgeport, Michigan, for thirty-six years. Since becoming the pastor, the church has grown to be the largest independent Baptist church in Michigan. Dr. Ouellette has led his church through major building programs and the purchase of over fifty acres of land. Dr. Ouellette is the editor of *The Preacher's Page* newsletter and preaches in churches and conferences all across the nation.



Dr. David Gibbs, Jr. founded the Christian Law Association, a nationwide legal ministry defending Christian liberty. For over twenty years, CLA has represented 10,000 churches in all fifty states. Attorney Gibbs is recognized as one of the leading constitutional lawyers. He has appealed and argued before fifteen different state supreme courts. 










Administration Building Map

Leading Through a Church Building Program

Mike Norris

Introduction:

Some obvious spiritual details:

- 1. The Church must find the mind of God through His Word—be convinced! (James 1:5)
- 2. The Church must pray for the power of God in this decision! (1 Cor. 2:5)
- 3. The Church must have Faith in God! (Heb. 10:38)
- 4. Every member must die to self! No one person in the congregation will have more vision for the ministry than the Pastor. We must pitch in and help the Pastor with good information and encouragement.

I. _____ Phase—What do we need?

- A. Is there a need for an outside consultant
- B. What are the needs of this ministry now
 - 1. Study your attendance number
 - 2. Study your building's potential in relation to the number
 - 3. Determine if your building's appearance is hindering growth
 - 4. Determine if a restructuring of services would be wiser than building
 - 5. What type of building do we need? Auditorium, educational, nursery, other?
 - 6. What size of building do we need? Plan for the future, but do not overbuild!
- C. What are the needs of this ministry future—study demographics

- 1. Is your area growing or declining?
- 2. Is your area aging or getting younger
- 3. Is your area diverse culturally?
- D. Dream!
 - 1. Go look at other ministries
 - 2. Study building designs and plans
- E. Look ahead to the cost of upkeep—utilities, lawn, janitorial, maintenance
 - 1. Can you afford these?
 - 2. Will you need extra staff?
- F. Personnel—know the state of your flock.
 - 1. Is the Pastor is pure?
 - 2. The Deacon's?
 - 3. The staff?
 - 4. Are there any bombs in the closet? Church building programs do not make problems in the Church go away—they create them!

II. _____ Phase—What is God doing here?

- A. Get the Deacon/leaderships approval—sell it!
- B. Start preaching messages revealing the needs of the ministry—get them to "Catch the Vision!"
- C. Get the people's approval—vote to study the building program
- D. Set the Church to praying!
- E. Fire up giving to the Building Fund again!

III. _____ Phase—What can we afford, and how do we pay for it?

A. Paying for the building

- 1. Remember, the final cost of the project will likely be more.
- 2. Can you pay cash?
- 3. Do you want to take the time to raise the cash?
- 4. Do you want to make a loan?
 - a. Remember that when it comes to churches, banks loan money on cash flow basis—not necessarily on assets that the Church may own.
 - b. This means you will have to set your financial house in order with good accurate bookkeeping.
 - c. The bank may require an audit. Are you ready for this?
- B. Do not count on the wealthy people in your Church. They could be gone right when you need them!
- C. When totaling available money for building, only include giving to the general fund, not missions, school, etc. Money that is designated cannot be spent on building!
- D. Consider how many people you can add to your Church through this building program. Churches usually grow during a building program
 - 1. Excitement
 - 2. Fulfillment
 - 3. Curiosity
- E. A good way to find money is through soulwinning—new people add money!
- F. Fundraising
 - 1. Church bonds program
 - 2. Capital campaigns
 - 3. Internal fundraising—for modest endeavors

IV. _____ Phase—How shall we build it?

- A. Do not go cheap on the design phase
- B. Hiring the Architect
 - 1. Know what your needs are before you sit down with the architect
 - 2. Make sure that your architect is experienced in designing Churches, especially, soulwinning churches and the way they function vs. more denominational type churches.
 - 3. Include only those people that are necessary in the design phase or else the arguing over color and taste will never end.
 - 4. Check all references that the architect gives you. Go look at his projects
- C. Design what you need, not what you want!
 - 1. Functionality is more important than appearance.
 - 2. That doesn't mean you throw appearance out the window.
 - 3. You need to have a good idea of what you want your building to look like and what best suits your area geographically, or else, resourceful and "artsy" architects will talk you into a design that is not tasteful and too expensive!

D. Things to consider in design:

- 1. Type of plans
 - a. Pre-developed plans—prototype buildings
 - b. Custom drawn plans
 - c. Consider a site plan so that you do not junk up your available property
- 2. Building structure types—pre-engineered, steel, concrete, masonry, wood, portable, etc.
- 3. Sound/acoustics, security, services, storage...
- 4. Spirit/atmosphere
- E. Working with local government

- F. Working with codes and permits
- G. Take the time to include every little detail that you can at the design phase.
 - 1. Remember that changes made after the design can be very expensive and can seriously delay construction.
 - 2. Also, the fire permits may not allow the change after construction has started.
- H. Track your cost within the budget—stay honest here!

New Vision for an Older Church

Kurt Skelly

Introduction:

God has historically raised up men at strategic times and locations to recognize, communicate, and activate His vision for His people. The local pastor is one such man whom God has called to lead in this way. In what ways can a pastor discover and implement the vision God has given him? How best can he accomplish this in a church that has become sedentary?

I. _____ of the New Vision

By what process can the pastor discover God's vision for the local church?

A. _____ the Lord

It is not the job of the pastor to create vision; it is his job to get alone with God and recognize the vision the Lord already has for His church.

God grants His perspective to the leader is in order that he may effectively lead God's people.

B. _____ the Landscape

Each situation is different. Jericho and Ai demand a different strategy. God's servant must be aware of his situation and act accordingly.

Consider the contrasting methods by which Paul evangelized Philippi, Athens, and Corinth.

Change always brings with it certain challenges. Recognizing those challenges before we meet them provides us with the opportunity to neutralize their potentially harmful effect. Most of us are aware of the process by which change is received: (1) Opposition; (2) Suspicion or Tolerance; (3) Acceptance; (4) Endorsement. Although admittedly simplistic, these steps tend to be remarkably accurate, even in the context of the local church.

A. _____ Mistakes

The timing surrounding the communication and implementation of a vision is almost as important as the vision itself.

Often the unpalatable necessity to wait falls within the framework of God's vision for His people.

B. _____ Motivations

The pastor must examine himself carefully to ascertain the integrity of his motives in the potential change.

Leaders who advance their own agenda and masquerade it as the Lord's are guilty of the worst kind of dishonesty.

People tend to "stake out turf" and "mark their territory" in ministry. New vision often threatens to invade those staked-out claims and displace them.

The pastor must lovingly remind his people of the inevitability of change and the flexibility requisite for a ministry to be truly effective.

How can I say this tenderly? We live in a day of utter parental ignorance, parental complacency, and parental passivity!

In the verses above we see a pattern—a God-given structure:

- Parents are commanded to train up and nurture children.
- Parents are permitted to appoint tutors and spiritual authorities to assist in training.
- Parents are turning their hearts away from their responsibilities expecting tutors to step in.
- This is the modern day platform of most youth ministries youth leaders attempting to do what parents are failing to do. (Something must change. This is not God's pattern.)

More often in student ministry, I find myself laboring to get teenagers to be passionate and committed to a God that their parents are casual and indifferent toward!

This is a 45-minute meeting after Sunday night service for just the parents. Sometimes we invite the kids in as well.

At first teen-parent meetings are intimidating, but parents GREATLY appreciate them! The content is the key. Providing helpful principles and insight will cause parents to long for this meeting!

In addition to this, we offer daily assistance in the form of counseling, intervention, and responsiveness to requests. We also offer parent training in the form of a Wednesday night discipleship class, and much through the regular adult classes of the church.

I believe one of the greatest keys to effective youth ministry is having trust and influence—and you can only have that by staying someplace long enough to establish it.

Early in youth ministry people loan you respect—it's borrowed by a title or from a pastor. Nothing can speed up the process. There are no short cuts. But the longer you stay and serve, the more influence and trust you will build with the people within your influence.

A few thoughts about building trust and influence:

- A. Stay in youth ministry a long time (watch kids grow up!)
