General Guidelines

- 1. Students will have one hour to complete their creative writing.
- 2. No reference material may be used.
- 3. The writing should be legible to judges.
- 4. Previously written prose or poetry is unacceptable.
- 5. Beginning this year, each school will select one day for a Creative Writing Day from February 15-22, 2019. This date must be submitted on the Fine Arts site. You will need to download the proctoring form from the Fine Arts site that will give you requirements regarding administering the test.

Creative Writing: Prose

Description: An original written selection that tells a story correlating with the title given at the time of competition.

Prose Narrative – A narrative reveals a story with a message. It uses great descriptive words to allow the reader see characters, places, and events. A good beginning and good ending are important. A novel is a good example.

Prose Expository – Expository writing uses facts and evidence to support the writer's purpose or position on a subject. A research paper is a good example.
